Concert:

The uploaded video must be an **unedited** video recording of your performance test (10 minutes).

It is your responsibility that the video footage and sound provide the board with enough information to evaluate the presentation.

Please consider the following, which is very important!:

a. Camera angle: both you and your instrument must appear clearly in the picture/frame b. Microphone placement and instrument balance: The board must be able to hear you clearly and the balance between the musicians must be appropriate

c. Recording level: Please be aware that the sound must not be either too loud or too low

It's very important that no login or subscription is required for the examiners to watch your video, so you can e.g. use a private YouTube channel which is accessible via a direct link only.

General Musical skills:

Before the admission you must have the following ready: A good internet connection with cable (not wireless) The Zoom-program installed on your computer A musicplayer (software), that can receive and play MP3-files Main instrument Good headphones (connected to your computer) An acoustic piano or a keyboard with loudspeakers (that brings the sound out in the room) Music-sheet (paper with note system) and pen

Singing, dancing and playing:

Before the admission you must have the following ready:

A good internet connection with cable (not wireless)

The Zoom-program installed on your computer

Good headphones (connected to your computer)

A conga/djembe, a bass drum (could be the floor drum from a drum set) + two drumsticks. It is also necessary with space for dance/movement
