

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

RAMA expects students to have a good working knowledge of English.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL STUDENTS

The primary language of instruction and examination is Danish. English will be used whenever individuals who do not speak or understand Danish are present.

Students must be able to follow and actively participate in teaching conducted in English at a level equivalent to B2 (Independent user) on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) scale.

A person at B2 level can typically:

- understand the main ideas of relatively complex texts;
- participate actively in meetings and discussions;
- communicate fluently with native speakers without significant effort on either side;
- present and justify arguments for and against different viewpoints; and
- write clear reports, emails, and academic or professional texts.

We encourage prospective students with limited English proficiency to improve their English skills before enrolling.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-EU/EEA APPLICANTS

Non-EU/EEA applicants who wish to apply for a full degree study must provide documentation of a sufficient level of English language proficiency equivalent to CEFR B2. Applicants can do this by providing documentation that complies with either 1) or 2) below:

1):

Applicants must submit documentation for ONE of the following test results:

IELTS Academic

Minimum 5,5 overall score

Minimum 5,5 in the speaking and listening components

TOEFL Academic internet-based test

Minimum 60 overall score

Minimum scores for each component: Listening - 14, Speaking – 17

LanguageCert International ESOL B2 (Communicator)

Overall pass

Minimum 50% for speaking and writing components

Besides the submitted test certificate, applicants may be called to participate in a short online interview and language screening. At the interview, you will be expected to:

- Demonstrate ability to participate actively in a conversation
- Speak and give details about a general topic
- Express yourself clearly and in sufficient length and detail

The final assessment of the applicant's language sufficiency will be made based on the submitted language test and language screening.

Please note:

- Book your language test well in advance, as there may be a waiting period both for obtaining a test appointment and for receiving your test results.

- The test must be taken no earlier than three years before the date of application.
- Spot checks will be conducted to verify the submitted test certificates.

2):

Applicants must provide documentation showing that they have completed secondary or tertiary education at an institution where English is the language of instruction, either:

- a) in a country where English is an official language, such as Canada, the United States, England, Ireland, Scotland, Singapore, Australia, or New Zealand; or
- b) at a school located in a country where English is **not** an official language, for example an international school.

Applicants under category (b) will be required to participate in an interview to verify their English language proficiency.

The secondary level of education is typically equivalent to the high school level, and tertiary education is typically equivalent to the university level.
